Continuing Education Credits (CEC's) Basic Rules

CERTIFICATION RENEWAL FEES

Every year operator certification renewal fees are due by June 30. The renewal fee pays for the following fiscal year (July 1- June 30).

CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDITS (CECs)

Every even-numbered year appropriate CEC requirements must be met by May 31. The current two-year biennium began on June 1, 2020 and will end on May 31, 2022.

OPERATORS CERTIFIED BEFORE JANUARY 2021 ARE REQUIRED TO EARN THE FOLLOWING CECs:

Class 1 WATER operators (either or both water distribution or treatment) must earn 2.0 CECs (20 hours).

Class 2, 3, or 4 WATER operators (either or both water distribution or treatment) must earn 1.0 CECs (10 hours).

Class 5 WATER operators must earn 0.4 CECs (4 hours).

Class 1 WASTEWATER operators (either or both municipal or industrial wastewater) must earn 2.0 CECs (20 hours).

Class 2, 3, or 4 WASTEWATER operators must earn 1.0 CECs (10 hours).

Class 2, 3 or 4 ON-SITE WASTEWATER must earn 1.0 CECs (10 hours).

Class 2, 3 or 4 INDUSTRIAL WASTEWATER must earn 1.0 CECs (10 hours).

OPERATORS-IN-TRAINING (OITs) ARE REQUIRED TO EARN THE FOLLOWING CECS:

Class 1 WATER OITs (either or both water distribution or treatment) must earn 1.0 CECs (10 hours).

Class 2, 3, or 4 WATER OITs (either or both water distribution or treatment) must earn 0.5 CECs (5 hours).

Class 5AB is no longer offered as a new certification.

Class 1 WASTEWATER OITs (combined class 1 & 2 municipal) must earn 1.0 CECs (10 hours).

Class 3 WASTEWATER OITs (combined class 3 & 4 municipal) must earn 0.5 CECs (5 hours).

Class 1 INDUSTRIAL WASTEWATER OITs must earn 1.0 CECs (10 hours).

Class 2, 3 or 4 INDUSTRIAL WASTEWATER OITs must earn 0.5 CECs (5 hours).

Class 2, 3 or 4 ON-SITE WASTEWATER OITs must earn 0.5 CECs (5 hours).

COURSE APPROVAL and REPORTING

Before CECs can be earned for a course, the course must be approved for credit. Courses not listed in this calendar may be approved for CECs if deemed applicable by the Certification Office. Courses MUST BE reported on an **INDIVIDUAL APPLICATION FORM** which contains the signature of the course provider or a Certificate of Completion submitted with the form.

CORRESPONDENCE COURSES & ALTERNATIVE TRAINING COURSES

Correspondence courses and alternative training courses (CD-ROM, internet, videos) must be fully completed and proof of completion from the course provider must be sent to the Certification Office for CECs. (See Lists of Approved Correspondence Courses and Alternative Training Courses in the back of this calendar.)

COURSES APPROVED for DUAL CECs

Operators who hold certification in both water and wastewater can earn CECs for both certifications when attending a course MTDEQ has approved as a dual CEC course.

COURSES ONLY APPROVED for ONE-HALF CECs

Training not directly applicable to water or wastewater plant operation can be approved for training but may only earn one-half the amount of CECs. Remember a CPR class is only good for credit the first time you take it.

TRAINING NOT LISTED in TRAINING CALENDAR

There may be courses that apply towards your CEC requirements which are **not listed in the Training Calendar**. If you are looking for courses in your area, call the Certification Program Office, (406) 444-3434, for information on approved courses.





The Association was organized in 1944 and soon thereafter affiliated with the Federation of Sewage Works Association, now known as the Water Environment Federation (WEF) <u>www.wef.org.</u> The Association is committed to advancing science and education, disseminating technical information, increasing public understanding, and promoting sound public policy in the water quality and water resource field. Present membership in MWEA is approximately 125.

The Water Environment Federation is a nonprofit professional, education, and technical organization devoted to providing leadership, knowledge and guidance in the management of our nation's water resources. Founded in 1928, the Federation has more than 40,000 members in 72 member associations, five corresponding associations and six recognized operator associations located throughout the world. Water Environment Federation members include engineers, scientists, wastewater treatment plant operators and managers, and others working in state and local government, federal agencies, industry, academia, and private practice.

The Water Federation has pledged to provide leadership and guidance to all constructive efforts contributing to the control of water pollution. Therefore, in 1984, WEF created the Professional Wastewater Operations Division to meet the special interests and needs of the operators.

OPERATOR SCHOLARSHIPS: MWEA has allocated funds for certified operators looking for assistance in paying for continuing education and/or training event costs. Applicants must complete a scholarship application one month ahead of the training session they plan to attend. Awards up to \$500 can be realized by each applicant. When approved in advance, the award money can be used to pay for the actual training as well as other miscellaneous costs associated with attending.
